She is involved in many performing ensembles at SDSU including Concert Choir, Opera Workshop, Madrigal Singers, The Pride of the Dakotas Marching Band, Symphonic Band, Jazz Band, Pep Band, and has accompanied the University Men's Chorus. During her college career, Sarah has won the SDMTA intercollegiate piano and vocal competitions, the SDSU Civic Symphony Aria competition, and was recently a featured soloist at Dakota Wesleyan University. She is a member of the Senior Choir at First Lutheran Church in Brookings, and frequently serves as cantor. Her vocal instructor is Dr. Emily Wood Toronto, and her piano instructor is Dr. John Walker. Following graduation from SDSU, Sarah plans on pursuing a Master's degree in vocal performance.

Sarah is a 2005 graduate of Eagle Grove High School, where she participated in all vocal and instrumental ensembles, high school and community theatre, various honor bands, honor choirs, and All-State Band. Sarah received Division I ratings at solo and ensemble contests each year in high school. She participated in IMTA piano competitions, twice winning her regional division. In 2004, Sarah traveled to Europe with the Iowa Ambassadors of Music Chorus. During high school, her piano instructors were Ms. Roi Anne Gearhart, and Dr. David Piersel, and her vocal instructor was Ms. Julie Anna Holtan. Sarah is a member of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church.

**Sidney Baker** presently is chancel choir director of the Clarion United Methodist Church and teaches music related courses at the Iowa Central Community College campuses in Fort Dodge, Webster City, and Eagle Grove. He also teaches string students privately at his studio in Clarion. He and his wife Susan own and manage the Clarion Inn Bed and Breakfast in Clarion.

Prior to moving to Clarion in 1997 Sidney made his home in Asheville, North Carolina, where he built a successful career performing as a soloist, a chamber music musician, and a symphony cellist throughout the Southeastern section of the United States. During that same time he taught at several colleges and universities as well as conducted his own youth orchestras.

Sidney received his Bachelor's degree in cello performance at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City and his Master's degree, also in cello performance, at the Converse College School of Music in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

**David Moglebust** earned his B.M.Ed. from Wartburg College in 1979. After graduation from Wartburg, Mr. Moglebust became the first Resident in Church Music at Central Lutheran Church, Minneapolis, MN, under the tutelage of Dr. John Ferguson. He received his M.M. in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota in 1984.

David has served as a full-time church musician at First Lutheran Church, Brookings, SD, St. Olaf Lutheran Church, Austin, MN, Roseville Lutheran Church, Roseville, MN, and is currently the organist at the Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd in Webster City, IA and St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Fort Dodge, IA. David has also played organ dedication recitals for several churches throughout the upper midwest. In addition to his duties as organist, David accompanies the Eagle Grove Chorale and the Paddlewheel Players community theatre, and plays alto saxophone in the Karl L. King Municipal Band in Fort Dodge.

David and his wife, Cathy, also operate a music engraving service out of their home, working with major publishing companies and composers nationwide. They have collaborated with each other on several published arrangements for handbells, organ, brass and choir. Mr. Moglebust and his family reside in rural Eagle Grove, Iowa, on his 113 year-old family farm.
